

5 Card or Caribbean Stud Poker

The Rules of Stud Poker - The value of your chips is written on the chip itself, the values are 5's 25's, 100's and 500's, so when a guest hands over a 100 note, they would get 100 worth of chips (Usually 10 5's and 2 25's). When you're done playing at the Stud Poker and wish to leave or play at another table, please redeem your chips in exchange for a Fun Casino Check so the chips can be used by other guests once you have left.

In Stud Poker everyone plays against the dealer. Players will place their 1st bet on the Ante square in front of them., Each player will receive 5 cards face down and the dealer's first 4 cards face down and the fifth is face up. The object of the game is to beat the hand the dealer has with the 5 cards you have.

The Player will look at their cards and decide whether to 'Fold' or 'Raise' If player folds they forfeit their cards and ante bet will be taken away. If the player Raises, they must place the cards face down on the Raise Square and place their Raise bet on top., The raise must be exactly double their Ante bet. (e.g. If your Ante is 5, your raise can only be 10).

After this, the dealer will turn over their cards and reveal what hand they have. The dealer must have an Ace and a King or higher to qualify. If the dealers hand is any lower (e.g. Ace, Queen, Jack, 10, 9) It is not a qualifying hand then the Raise is Pushed and the Ante is paid out Evens.

If the Dealer qualifies and beats the Player, Both Ante & Raise will lose.

If the Dealer qualifies and the cards are a tie, both Ante and Raise will push.

If the Dealer Qualifies and loses to the Player, the Ante is paid even money and the Raise is paid on what hand the player beat the dealer on.

Payout Odds & Hands

• Pair or Lower	1 to 1 (Evens)
• Two Pair	2 to 1
• Three of a Kind	3 to 1
• Straight	4 to 1
• Flush	5 to 1
• Full House	7 to 1
• Four of a Kind	20 to 1
• Straight Flush	50 to 1
• Royal Flush	100 to 1
